# NAVARRE WOMAN CHARGED WITH FINANCIAL EXPLOITATION OF DISABLED CLIENTS



The Residential Services Director of a local organization that works to help the disabled has been charged with 24 felony counts of exploiting her clients.

64-year old Linda Faye Walker-Hall of 1023 Jo Tam Lane in Navarre turned herself in today. Walker-Hall also is also charged with grand theft.

OCSO investigators say Walker-Hall was stealing money from twenty-four residential group home patients with Horizons in Fort Walton Beach.

Horizons managers became suspicious in April after spotting discrepancies while reviewing some monthly transaction reports for clients' personal allowance funds. They questioned Walker-Hall and also found policy violations involving receipts. In addition, when they asked Walker-Hall to retrieve the cash bag, Walker-Hall had the bag containing \$2900.00 at her home. The Department of Children and Families and the O-C-S-O were contacted and became involved in investigating the financial discrepancies.

OCSO investigators were able to determine that Walker-Hall was issued sixteen checks between January 2012 and April 2013 for the amount of \$43,677.16. After reviewing each residential group home client's spending reports, they discovered \$22,804.16 in unaccounted money.

Walker-Hall was arrested on twenty four counts of exploitation of disabled adults and grand theft.

Sheriff Larry Ashley said, "Countless people at Horizons have worked tirelessly on behalf of our disabled residents and it is indeed sad when one individual entrusted with assisting instead decides to take advantage of people and then work to hide her tracks. I want to applaud the managers who saw discrepancies and immediately took action to ensure a thorough investigation was conducted."

#### [ STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE / NARRATIVE ]

On 04/25/13, I was contacted by Department of Children and Families Adult Protective Investigator Scott Barlow in reference to intake report number 2013-114590-01, in which allegations were made that the Residential Services Director, Linda Walker-Hall, was stealing money from twenty-four (24) residential group home patient at Horizon's, 123 Truxton Avenue, Fort Walton Beach, Florida.

Contact was made with Chief Operating Officer Melissa "Missy" Rogers and Chief Financial Officer Holly Kaspar. They provided statements as to the procedure on how Horizon's operates in regards to the residential group home patients finances: Around the first of each month Horizon's is paid by Social Security for each client. These costs are to pay for the housing and personal allowance for each client. Clients receive between \$90 to \$200 a month in personal allowance depending on their financial background. The personal allowance is to be used to pay for doctor co-pays, toiletries, outings, and any other items the clients wish to purchase. All twenty-four clients personal allowance money is placed onto one check written to Walker-Hall. She cashes the check and is supposed to distribute the money to the group home managers when they ask for additional money for each client. group home managers and they money spent for each client per month. Any receipts were supposed to be attached to the Spending Reports to verify each purchase. It was policy of Horizon's that each time money is received by the group home managers or an items is purchased that it is initialed on the spending report. Walker-Hall would initial that she provided the group home manager any money.

Kaspar explained while reviewing the monthly transaction in preparation for a periodic Social Security audit, she found that the spending reports turned in by Walker-Hall would list an even \$20 per week for personal spending and \$10 for toiletries every month. There were very few, and sometimes zero, receipts turned in to back-up the spending being recorded. This was consistent with each client being given the money weekly. The group home manager were asked how much money they receive monthly for each client and all three told Kaspar that they receive \$10 possibly \$20 per month.

On 04/22/13, Kaspar and Rogers spoke with Walker-Hall about the discrepancy in money. Walker-Hall stated the weekly \$20 personal and \$10 toiletry amounts listed were given to the Group Home Managers to spend for client incidentals. She said the group home managers were required to turn in the spending reports and receipts at the end of each month. When asked why all the receipts were not turned in to accounting, Linda said she was not required for purchases under \$20. Kaspar and Rogers asked Walker-Hall why one some months where the client would, for example, receive \$200 for personal allowance why she would document them only receiving \$150. Walker-Hall had no explanation and became upset. Kaspar and Rogers noticed the spending reports turned in by Walker-Hall were not initialed, which was required by their policy. Linda was questioned as to why the reports were not initialed at each transaction and she replied it was used for the client's to initial when they received money. When they asked Walker-Hall to retrieve the cash bag from the accounting office, Walker-Hall said it was not in the accounting office as it was at her residence. Two board members followed Walker-Hall to her residence to retrieve the case bag. Inside the bag was \$2,900; \$2,000 in wrapped \$100 bills, \$500 in \$20 bills, and the rest in lower denominations.

Kaspar and Rogers went into Walker-Halls office and found spending reports in her shred box. The spending reports were the ones maintained by the group home managers which were properly initialed. The spending reports showed that the clients were not receiving the amount Walker-Hall was documenting that she provided to the group home managers.

Nikki Owens, Horizon's Residential Services Coordinator, was interviewed. She stated she worked for Walker-Hall and prior to that was a group home manager. She stated the policy was that each time a transaction took place with the money the spending report would be initialed documenting who did each transactions. Such as if Walker-Hallwould provide the group home manager money she would initial the spending report. When the group home manager would run low on money they would contact Walker-Hall requesting additional money. Owens stated on many occasions she would have to purchase toiletries for the clients with her own money because Walker-Hall would tell her there was no more money available.

The group home managers (Gerald Dain, Kristeena Jimenez, and Doris Mack) were all interviewed. They all stated each client would receive approximately \$20 per client per month. When the money was gone they would contact Walker-Hall who would either tell them the client had no additional money or would take between one to two weeks to return the money to them. The clients money was to be used for doctor co-pays, toiletries, outings, and other items. There were several occasions where the group home managers would have to purchase the clients toiletries because they had no money to buy them on their own. They believed that the clients were only allotted \$20 per month for personal spending.

On 06/26/13, a non-custodial interview was conducted with Walker-Hall. She was read the allegations and denied stealing money from any of the clients. She explained she did not keep accurate records for several years. Walker-Hall was asked why there was a discrepancy between the spending reports she turned in and the ones found in her shred box. She stated the money not provided to the group home managers she would use to purchase the toiletries. She said she did not keep accurate records of her spending but would purchase the necessary items for each of the clients. Walker-Hall was asked about the money bag. She said she was supposed to store it in the safe but would keep it with her in the event she needed the money to purchase something for the clients. She did keep it at her residence especially on the weekends in case a group home manager contacted her needing additional money.

Upon reviewing the records provided by Horizon's, it was confirmed that all twenty-four group home clients were considered disabled adults per F.S.S. 825.101(4). The records show that Walker-Hall was issued 16 checks between January 2012 and April 2013 for the amount of \$43,677.16. After reviewing each residential group home clients spending reports it was learned that there was \$22,804.16 in unaccounted for money in which Walker-Hall stated she received in

the checks for the clients to where the group home managers documented they received.

Based upon the above facts, it is believed that Linda Walker-Hall did commit the offenses of Exploitation of the Elderly/Disable Adult (24 counts) per F.S.S. 825.103 (2)(c) and Grand Theft per F.S.S. 812.014 (2)(b), for the theft of money from 24 residential group home clients which she was trusted with their finances. These offenses occurred in Fort Walton Reach, Florida, within Okaloosa County where I am a sworn Law Enforcement Officer
