### **ALERT CITIZEN HELPS LEAD DEPUTIES TO BURGLARY SUSPECTS**

**Dakota Shawn Collins** 

A man who spotted a car he thought may be involved in car burglaries on Okaloosa Island Tuesday morning contacted the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office when he spotted the black SUV leave the area of Bluefish Drive and head over to the Breakers Condominiums on Santa Rosa Boulevard.

Deputies arrived and found one of the suspects, 23-year old John Reedy of Fort Walton Beach, in a car full of items which they believe were stolen. Another suspect, 19-year old Dakota Collins, had taken off, dropping a camouflage colored backpack.

Deputies searching the area eventually found Collins trying to hide in the water behind Palm Court Yacht Club on Bream Avenue.

Reedy and Collins are now charged with burglary and theft. Both admitted to deputies that they had been "car-hopping", stealing items from cars and/or from outside homes on Okaloosa Island. Reedy told deputies he needed money to help his family and Collins said he needed money because he was out of work.

Items recovered include tools, a wallet, a laptop computer, and a knife.

### [ STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE / NARRATIVE ]

On 04-30-13 at approximately 0745 hours, I was contacted by Sgt William Griffith, unit # 40, who stated his deputies had two adult male individuals detained in reference to car burglaries that occurred on Okalossa Island that morning. Per Sgt Griffith, a concerned citizen observed a black in color sports utility vehicle in the area that may have been involved in vehicle burglaries. The citizen observed the defendant's vehicle leaving the area of Bluefish Drive, and enter the parking lot of Breakers, located at 381 Santa Rosa Blvd, Fort Walton Beach, Florida, and contacted law enforcement. The citizen then observed that one of the suspect's was attempting to leave the parking lot area and was carrying a camouflage colored backpack, which he dropped on the ground. The other suspect was still in the vehicle, which was parked.

Upon Deputy Michael Evans arrival, contact was made with defendant John Edward Reedy, who was still in the vehicle. Deputy Evans noted that the vehicle was full of items which were possibly stolen. Post Miranda, Reedy agreed to answer the deputy's questions. During the interview, Reedy admitted that he and his co-defendant, Dakota Collins, were together the previous evening and into the morning hours. Reedy stated Collins told him that they could make money over on Okaloosa Island, so they drove to a residential area on or near Bluefish Drive where they parked, got out of the vehicle they were traveling in, and began "car-hopping". There, Collins went one way and Reedy another, stealing items from automobiles and/or from the curtilages of residences. The defendant stated that he had planned to sell the stolen items as he needed to provide financial assistance to his family as his mother is in the hospital and very sick.

When Sgt Griffith arrived on scene, the concerned citizen informed him of the direction of travel for co-defendant Dakota Collins. Sgt Griffith observed him and yelled for him to stop, which he failed to do. By the time Sgt Griffith made it to the area where the suspect was sighted, he could no longer be seen. Shortly afterwards, Deputy Piaget and Deputy Corbitt located Collins in the water behind the Palm Court Yacht Club, located at 321 Bream Ave, Fort Walton Beach, Florida. Collins had entered the water and was attempting to evade the deputies.

Post Miranda, Collins admitted to being with defendant John Reedy the previous evening and into the morning hours. Collins further stated that the two drove to Okaloosa Island where they split up and stole items from vehicles in the area. The defendant stated he was in need of money and did not start work on his new job until the following day. He admitted to taking several items but did not know exactly what the bags he had stolen contained. He also admitted to dropping the backpack in the parking lot.

During the investigation, the backpack which was dropped in the parking lot by co-defendant Dakota Collins was opened to determine it's contents. Inside the backpack was identification which provided the name of Matthew Robert Nuss. Besides the identification, several items belonging to Nuss were located, to include a GETAC laptop computer in a black Craftsman bag, valued at approximately \$6,000, a Fluke digital multimeter, valued at \$300, a guitar distortion box, valued at \$50, a cable connector valued at \$100, miscellaneous computer cables valued at \$100, assorted tools valued at \$30, a wallet with it's contents valued at \$10, a knife with sheath valued at \$100, and a Leatherman tool valued at \$60. Nuss was contacted and provided a sworn written affidavit of complaint. In addition to the items recovered, Nuss stated he was still missing a Zune MP3 Player and an I-Phone cable. Nuss stated that his vehicle was parked in the parking lot of Breakers, which he left unlocked. Nuss stated he gave no one permission to enter and take any of the items.

Based upon the fact that the victim identified some of the recovered items as belonging to him which the co-defendant admitted to taking and dropping in the parking lot, and that those items were valued at approximately \$6,690, and the defendant knew that he and Collins were in the area to steal items from cars, I have reason to believe and do believe the defendant violated F.S.S. 810.02(4)(a), Burglary to Unoccupied Conveyance (Principle in the First Degree) and F.S.S. 812.014(2)(c), Theft > \$300, < \$20,000 (Principle in the First Degree). These offenses did occur in Okaloosa County, Florida, where your affiant is a sworn law enforcement officer.
