**PRESS RELEASE**

William Eddins, State Attorney for the First Judicial Circuit, announced today that Victor Todd Lundy of Crestview, Florida has been sentenced to 7 years state prison after entry of a plea to the charge of Trafficking in Methamphetamine (over 14 grams).

The charges arose on November 29, 2013 in Crestview, Florida when Okaloosa County Sheriff's deputies responded to information that Lundy was manufacturing Methamphetamine within his home. During the execution of a search warrant, approximately 28 grams of Methamphetamine was seized, along with equipment that was being used to manufacture Methamphetamine. Lundy admitted that he was involved in the production of Methamphetamine.

The sentence requires that Lundy serve the entire 7 year sentence with no early release. A mandatory fine of \$100,000 was also imposed as a condition of the sentence.

Circuit Judge Michael Flowers imposed the sentence. The Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office was responsible for the investigation and arrest. Assistant State Attorney Kimberly Torres was responsible for the prosecution.
