[STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE / NARRATIVE]

On 11/10/2016, I responded to 1069 Farmers St, Crestview, FL 32539 for a possible suicide involving a juvenile victim. The adult residents of the address were identified as the defendant, Robert Earl Smith, as well as codefendants Jentry Jamison-Smith and John Earnest Jamison. Also residing at the address were the six (6) children ranging in ages from 3-years old to 14-years old.

Upon my arrival, EMS personnel were actively performing lifesaving measures on a 9-year old male, later identified as the victim, Esau Jamison. The only adult at the residence during the initial response was codefendant John Jamison. Lifesaving measures were ultimately unsuccessful, and Esau was pronounced dead at North Okaloosa Medical Center at 3:55 pm.

The residence is a single-family home with no other subjects living in the home beyond the defendants and their children. The front yard was strewn with miscellaneous household items to include a toilet, bed frame and an oven. There was also a large amount of empty beer cans, bikes, coolers and trash thrown about the area. Upon entry into the home, there was a very strong ammonia type smell of urine and rotting trash. The interior of the house was in disarray and appeared to not have been cleaned in any manner in a very long period of time. Flowing across the floor of the width of the residence was a liquid which formed a puddle in the kitchen. The wooden floors in the area of this flow were wet and warped, indicating the presence of the fluid for a significant period of time. The kitchen was extremely dirty with trash overflowing onto the floor, and there were living and dead cockroaches on all surfaces.

One of the bedrooms within the residence was uninhabitable with a metal frame blocking the doorway and clothing piled from wall-to-wall at depths of approximately 18"-36". There were also only two beds and one couch observed suitable for sleeping the combined nine (9) adults and children within the home. The two bedrooms with beds, were also dirty and in disarray. The house also had no power, having been cut off the day before for lack of payment.

During a walk through of the residence with Department of Children and Families (DCF), and the defendant the night of 11/10/2016, the defendant stated the house was not normally in the condition it was during that day. The defendant claimed they were preparing to move, and the condition of the home was due to the family sorting and packing over the past couple of days.

According to codefendant Jentry Jamison-Smith, all nine (9) [REDACTED] stayed in a hotel room the night before Esau's death due to the power being shut off. Esau was in a good mood the morning of 11/10/2016, because they were skipping school and spending the day with codefendant John Jamison. Based on my investigation, Esau had been unsupervised and hanging for approximately one hour prior to being discovered by codefendant John Jamison.

The defendant and codefendant Jamison-Smith, have had near constant contact with DCF investigations since December, 2012. Since that date, there have been seven (7) investigations not including the investigation associated with this incident. The investigations have occurred within the Florida counties of Escambia, Okaloosa and Lee. The cases are outlined below in sequential order, beginning with the oldest investigation/report. Each summary is listed by its DCF intake number.

2012-284556-01, dated 12/10/2012: Investigation initiated after the codefendant Jentry Jamison-Smith brought then four-year old [REDACTED] to the doctor for a head injury. The child sustained a right parietal skull fracture and right scalp hematoma. Two of [REDACTED] siblings stated he fell of the bed striking his head. The codefendant Jamison-Smith stated she did not know how the injury happened, only that he was standing next to a coffee table when he fell "on his butt and then rolled and hit his head on the floor." [REDACTED] stated the defendant, Robert Smith, saw it happen and picked up the baby, but the defendant claimed to have no knowledge of how the child sustained the injury. The Child Protective Team (CPT) reviewed the case and verified there being inadequate supervision on the part of the defendants. The defendants refused referrals for services.

2013-184279-01, dated 07/05/2013: The codefendant Jamison-Smith was reported to have tested positive twice for marijuana and once for cocaine while pregnant with [REDACTED]. During an interview with a DCF investigator, the codefendant admitted smoking marijuana once or twice a month until she was three or four months pregnant. The codefendant claimed at the time she was smoking "marijuana in an attempt to control her nausea and to help her appetite." The defendant tested negative for all substances at the time of the baby's birth, but drug test results obtained by DCF from the physician indicated the positive presence of THC on January 4, and April 4, 2013. The defendant and codefendant were together as a couple at the time, [REDACTED].

2014-013952-01, dated 01/06/2014: Investigation began when oldest sibling [REDACTED] wrote a letter to one of her teachers, indicating codefendant Jamison-Smith "beats the children with an unknown object that leaves splinters." The teacher noted [REDACTED] had become quiet, withdrawn, would not make eye contact, and her grades had dropped dramatically in the second nine weeks of that school year. During interviews with [REDACTED], she stated [REDACTED] was spanked with a "switch" sometime during the previous year where splinters were left in his buttocks. [REDACTED] denied having to remove splinters from his buttocks and could not remember the last time he was spanked. Interviews with [REDACTED] indicated she did not always get breakfast because the defendants were not awake yet, and [REDACTED] did not want to wake them. [REDACTED] further stated during DCF interviews she heard the defendant and codefendant Jamison-Smith talk of selling medication that was prescribed to her brother [REDACTED].

2014-147232-01, dated 06/02/2014: Report received by DCF after receiving reports the defendants had their water service shut off, and children had been dirty and going outside to use the bathroom. The codefendant Jamison-Smith acknowledged the water service was terminated when the bill was not paid. The DCF investigator did note the floors needed to be cleaned. There was clutter in the kitchen and dirty dishes on the table and counter. Buckets of water were inside the home, the defendants were getting water from a neighbor. The DCF report did not note immediate danger to the children.

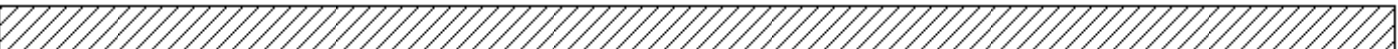
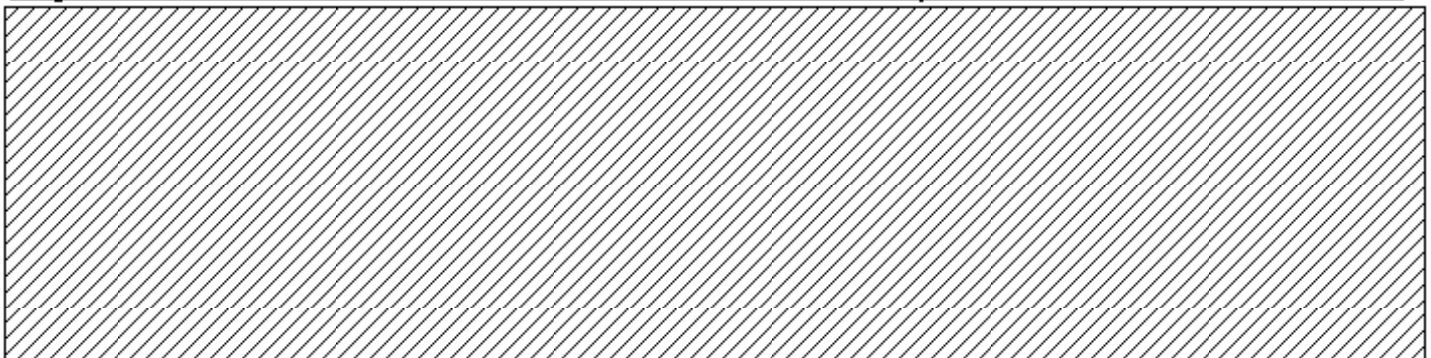
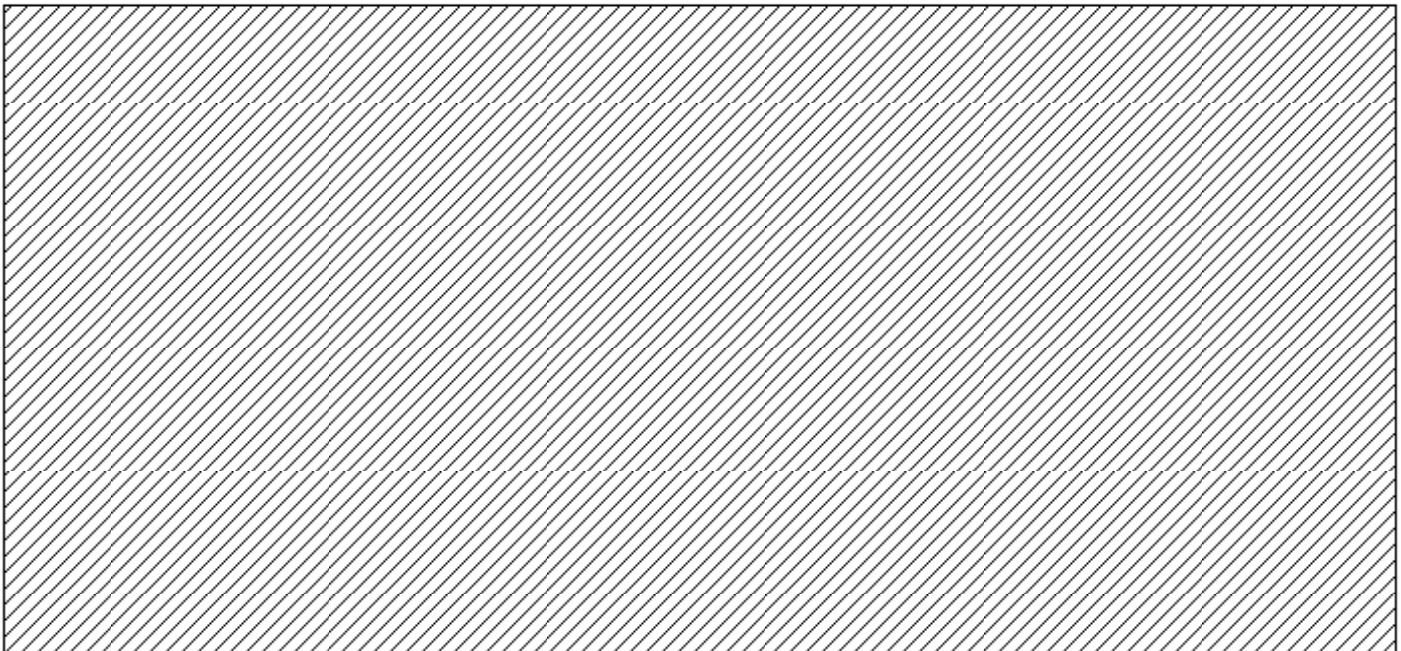

2014-263524-01, dated 10/04/2014: DCF concluded the report was generated as the result of the ongoing neighbor problem. DCF did not find indications of abuse or neglect, noting the older children primarily resided with codefendant John Jamison and his mother. The defendant and codefendant Jentry Jamison-Smith "declined the need for services."

2016-079635-01, dated 03/02/2016: DCF received information from the staff of a homeless shelter the defendant and codefendant Jamison-Smith were residing in Lee County, heroin and marijuana were found in the defendants' room. Both the defendant and codefendant Jamison-Smith denied any knowledge of narcotics being in their room, telling DCF workers, "someone must have planted whatever was found in the room." Codefendant Jamison-Smith subsequently tested positive for Buprenorphine without a prescription. The report noted the defendant and codefendant Jamison-Smith violated the safety plan put into place on 03/22/16 for the children to be living in and out of home non-relative placement. According to the DCF report, the defendant appeared to be under the influence of alcohol when he picked up the children from the safety manager's home. The children were also pulled from schools in Lee County and moved back to Crestview after an OTTIC was issued in Lee County.

The report summarized the defendant and codefendant Jamison-Smith "do not understand their protective role, and do not have a history of protecting"; referring to their responsibilities. Impending danger was noted for ongoing issues with substance misuse and inadequate supervision.



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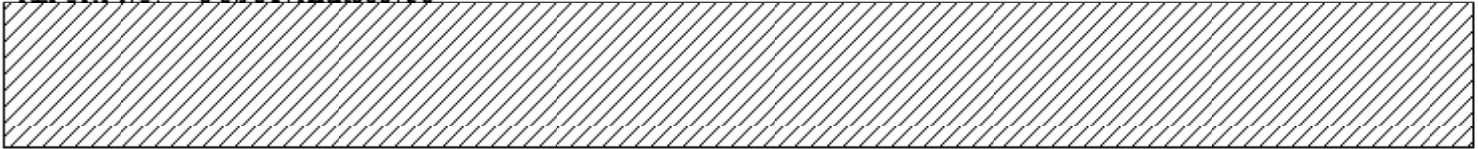

Based on my investigation, the evidence, near continuous interaction with DCF, repeated negative contact with law enforcement, and the findings from psychological evaluations, I have reason to believe and do believe, the defendant, Robert Earl Smith did violate FSS 827.03(2)(d) Child Neglect (six counts) by the defendant's repeated failure or omission to provide a child with the care, supervision, and services necessary to maintain the child's physical and mental health, including adequate shelter, supervision, and recommended services that a prudent person would consider essential for the well-being of the child. These conditions and environment ultimately led to injuries and the death of Esau Jamison. This offense occurred in Okaloosa County, Florida where I am a sworn law enforcement officer.



Codefendant Smith claimed they were preparing to move, and the condition of the home was due to the family sorting and packing over the past couple of days.

The bedroom Esau was found in was at the rear of the house. According to the defendant, this is the bedroom he shared with Esau and [REDACTED]. There was only one bed in the room, which the defendant stated all three of them shared. This bedroom was also dirty, strewn with clothes, trash, miscellaneous items and partially eaten food items. Within plain sight on the top shelf of the closet Esau was found hanging in was a double barreled shotgun. Clearly visible within a partially open dresser drawer were nine (9) 12 gauge, 2 3/4" shells. On top of the five-drawer chest, immediately next to the closet was a white rock substance, which based on my training and experience I believed to be "crack" cocaine. A presumptive field test of the substance showed a positive reaction for the presence of cocaine. A subsequent test conducted by FDLE, also showed positive results indicating the substance was cocaine. Both the ammunition and "crack" cocaine were within easy reach of any of the children within the residence.

The defendant stated he and [REDACTED] Esau and [REDACTED] had a great day together. The family stayed in a hotel room the night before Esau's death due to the power being shut off for lack of payment at the house. According to codefendant Jentry Jamison-Smith, Esau was in a good mood the morning of 11/10/2016, because they were skipping school and spending the day with the defendant. While he was unclear on exact times, the defendant stated he left the house at approximately 2:30 pm with Esau headed to a convenience store together. Part way to the store, Esau decided to go home so he could be there when his sister got off the bus. The defendant stated he returned home around 3:00 pm and discovered Esau hanging in the closet by a belt wrapped around his neck at one end, the free end of the belt was wrapped around the clothes bar in the closet. The defendant stated he discovered Esau when he went into the bedroom to look at Veterans Affairs paperwork and pulled the bed sheet from the window so he could read the papers.

During a subsequent interview with the defendant on 11/10/2016, conducted by DCF in my presence, he confirmed the living arrangements with him and the two boys. The defendant further stated he had severe PTSD as a result of his military service in Vietnam, which subsequently led to a 40-year history of addiction to alcohol, cocaine and marijuana. During this interview, the defendant appeared to be under the influence of unknown substances. The defendant was using a cane he was not using upon initial contact, kept attempting to leave the area, was unsteady on his feet, and had the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his person.

Prior to leaving 1069 Farmers St on 11/10/2016, a criminal history query was requested on the defendant through OCSO dispatch. The query results showed the defendant has multiple felony convictions. The defendant was convicted on 03/17/1992 for possession of cocaine; on 05/02/2005 and 03/21/2007, both convictions for driving while license suspended or revoked-habitual offender; and on 04/07/2014 for possession of cocaine. All convictions occurred within Okaloosa

Lifesaving measures were ultimately unsuccessful, and Esau was pronounced dead at North Okaloosa Medical Center at 3:55 pm.

The residence, is a single family with no other subjects living in the home beyond the defendants and [REDACTED] The front yard was strewn with miscellaneous household items to include a toilet, bed frame and an oven. There was also a large amount of empty beer cans, bikes, coolers and trash thrown about the area. Upon entry into the home, there was a very strong ammonia type smell of urine and rotting trash. The interior of the house was in disarray and appeared to not have been cleaned in any manner in a very long period of time. Flowing across the floor of the width of the residence was a liquid which formed a puddle in the kitchen. The wooden floors in the area of this flow were wet and warped, indicating the presence of the fluid for a significant period of time. The kitchen was extremely dirty with trash overflowing onto the floor, and there were living and dead cockroaches on all surfaces.

One of the bedrooms within the residence was uninhabitable with a metal frame blocking the doorway and clothing piled from wall-to-wall at depths of approximately 18"-36". There were also only two beds and one couch observed suitable for sleeping the combined nine (9) adults and children within the home. The two bedrooms with beds, were also dirty and in disarray. The house also had no power, having been cut off the day before for lack of payment.

During a walk through of the residence with Department of Children and Families (DCF), and codefendant Smith the night of 11/10/2016, codefendant Robert Smith stated the house was not normally in the condition it was during that day. Codefendant Smith claimed they were preparing to move, and the condition of the home was due to the family sorting and packing over the past couple of days.

According to the defendant, all nine (9) members of the family stayed in a hotel room the night before Esau's death due to the power being shut off. Esau was in a good mood the morning of 11/10/2016, because they were skipping school and spending the day with codefendant John Jamison. Based on my investigation, Esau had been unsupervised and hanging for approximately one hour prior to being discovered by codefendant John Jamison.

The defendant and codefendant Smith, have had near constant contact with DCF investigations since December, 2012. Since that date, there have been seven (7) investigations not including the investigation associated with this incident. The investigations have occurred within the Florida counties of Escambia, Okaloosa and Lee. The cases are outlined below in sequential order, beginning with the oldest investigation/report. Each summary is listed by its DCF intake number.

2012-284556-01, dated 12/10/2012: Investigation initiated after the defendant, Jentry Jamison-Smith, brought then four-year old [REDACTED] to the doctor for a head injury. The child sustained a right parietal skull fracture and right scalp hematoma. Two of [REDACTED] siblings stated he fell off the bed striking his head. The defendant stated she did not know how the injury happened, only that he was standing next to a coffee table when he fell "on his butt and then rolled and hit his head on the floor." The Child Protective Team (CPT) reviewed the case and verified there being inadequate supervision on the part of the defendants. The defendants refused referrals for services.

2013-184279-01, dated 07/05/2013: The defendant was reported to have tested positive twice for marijuana and once for cocaine while pregnant with [REDACTED] During an interview with a DCF investigator, the defendant admitted smoking marijuana once or twice a month until she was three or four months pregnant. The defendant claimed at the time she was smoking "marijuana in an attempt to control her nausea and to help her appetite." The defendant tested negative for all substances at the time of the baby's birth, but drug test results obtained by DCF from the physician indicated the positive presence of THC on January 4, and April 4, 2013.

2014-013952-01, dated 01/16/2014: Investigation began when oldest sibling [REDACTED] wrote a letter to one of her teachers, indicating the defendant "beats the children with an unknown object that leaves splinters." The teacher noted [REDACTED] had become quiet, withdrawn, would not make eye contact, and her grades had dropped dramatically in the second nine weeks of that school year. During interviews with [REDACTED] she stated [REDACTED] was spanked with a "switch" sometime during the previous year where splinters were left in his buttocks. [REDACTED] denied having to remove splinters from his buttocks and could not remember the last time he was spanked. Interviews with [REDACTED] indicated she did not always get breakfast because the defendants were not awake yet, and [REDACTED] did not want to wake them. [REDACTED] further stated during DCF interviews she heard the defendant and codefendant Smith talk of selling medication that was prescribed to her brother [REDACTED]

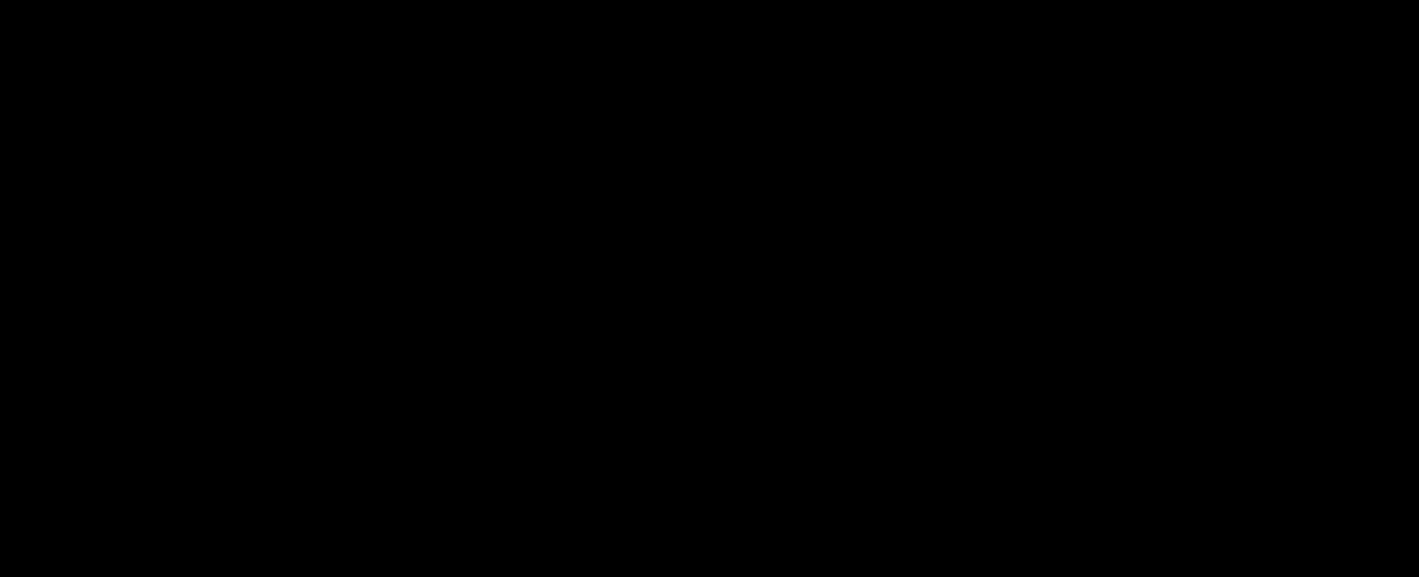

2014-147232-01, dated 06/02/2014: Report received by DCF after receiving reports the defendants had their water service shut off, and children had been dirty and going outside to use the bathroom. The defendant acknowledged the water service was terminated when the bill was not paid. The DCF investigator did note the floors needed to be cleaned. There was clutter in the kitchen and dirty dishes on the table and counter. Buckets of water were inside the home, the defendants were getting water from a neighbor. The DCF report did not note immediate danger to the children.

2014-263524-01, dated 10/04/2014: DCF concluded the report was generated as the result of the ongoing neighbor problem. DCF did not find indications of abuse or neglect, noting the older children primarily resided with codefendant John Jamison and his mother. The defendant and codefendant Robert Smith "declined the need for services."

2016-079635-01, dated 03/22/2016: DCF received information from the staff of a homeless shelter the defendant and codefendant Smith were residing in Lee County, heroin and marijuana were found in the defendants' room. Both the defendant and codefendant Robert Smith denied any knowledge of narcotics being in their room, telling DCF workers, "someone must have planted whatever was found in the room." The defendant subsequently tested positive for Buprenorphine without a prescription. The report noted the defendant and codefendant Smith violated the safety plan put into place on 03/22/16 for the children to be living in and out of home non-relative placement. According to the DCF report, codefendant Smith appeared to be under the influence of alcohol when he picked up the children from the safety manager's home. The children were also pulled from schools in Lee County and moved back to Crestview after an OTTIC was issued in Lee County.

The report summarized the defendant and codefendant Smith "do not understand their protective role, and do not have a history of protecting"; referring to their responsibilities. Impending danger was noted for ongoing issues with substance misuse and inadequate supervision.



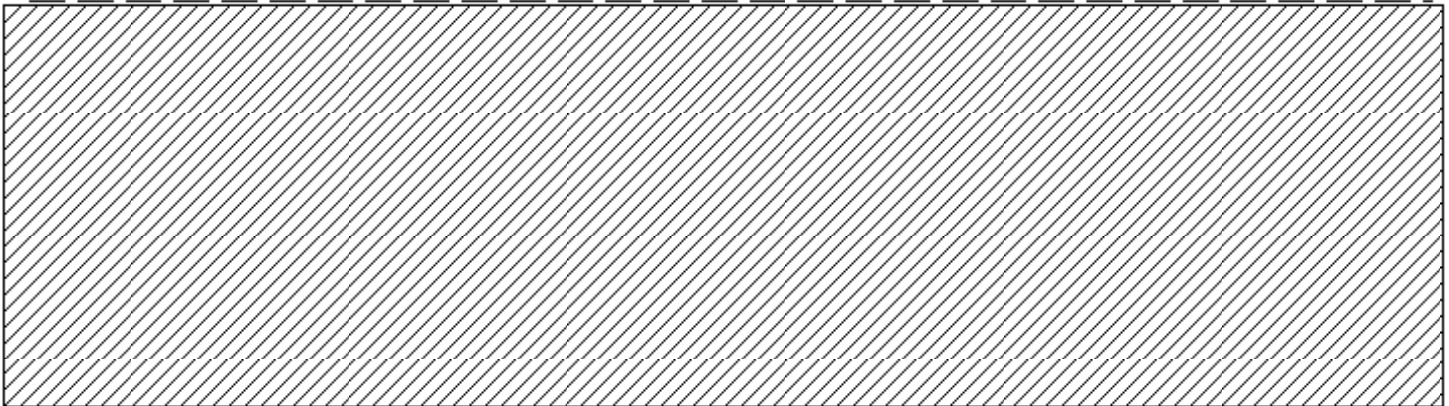

Based on my investigation, the evidence, near continuous interaction with DCF, repeated negative contact with law enforcement, and the findings from psychological evaluations, I have reason to believe and do believe, the defendant, Jentry Brienne Smith did violate FSS 827.03(2)(d) Child Neglect (six counts) by the defendant's repeated failure or omission to provide a child with the care, supervision, and services necessary to maintain the child's physical and mental health, including adequate shelter, supervision, and recommended services that a prudent person would consider essential for the well-being of the child. These conditions and environment ultimately led to injuries and the death of [redacted]. This offense occurred in Okaloosa County, Florida where I am a sworn law enforcement officer.
