[STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE / NARRATIVE]

On May 15, 2016, at approximately 0408 hours the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office responded to Red Rose Gentlemen's Club, 106 South Santa Rosa Blvd, Ft. Walton Beach, Florida, in reference to a reported shooting.

Upon arrival Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office Deputies found three individuals, Darrel Pickens, Angel Castilla and Dallas Corbitt had suffered gunshot wounds. All three required hospitalization, with Dallas Corbitt's wounds being extremely critical and requiring intensive critical care.

During the investigation it was discovered that the Defendant, Nkosi Albertie-Chamberlain, and another black male, later identified as Nkosi's brother, Blaise Albertie-Chamberlain, were in an altercation with several individuals, including Castilla and Pickens, inside the aforementioned establishment. Security for the establishment escorted the men outside of the business where another altercation ensued. During this second confrontation Nkosi Albertie-Chamberlain brandished a firearm and shot multiple times, subsequently striking the victims. Nkosi and Blaise Albertie-Chamberlain fled the area before the arrival of Law enforcement.

Upon review of surveillance videos from inside of the establishment, both Nkosi and Blaise Albertie-Chamberlain were identified by multiple investigators. The videos show multiple altercations occurring inside of the establishment. The first appears to involve Blaise Albertie-Chamberlain and multiple females. Nkosi Albertie-Chamberlain is near the altercation while it was occurring. Ultimately, Blaise is physically restrained and escorted from the area of the altercation toward the front door of the establishment. Nkosi followed and can be seen

engaging in a verbal altercation with Angel Castilla. Nkosi then struck Castilla with what appeared to be a closed fist. This prompted Darrel Pickens to strike Nkosi multiple times with a closed fist. The altercation poured out into an area out of camera view. A short time later, multiple individuals are seen running back through the establishment with victims Corbitt and Pickens retreating inside of the club and various individuals rendering medical aid.

During examination of the crime scene, three spent .40 caliber shell casings, silver in color, were located outside the front of the establishment (Evidence Exhibits 40, 41, and 42). These items were seized and later submitted to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement Crime Laboratory for various examinations.

On May 16, 2016, Investigators of the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office interviewed Darrel Pickens. Pickens stated he was in a physical confrontation with Blaise Albertie-Chamberlain and identified Nkosi Albertie-Chamberlain as the individual who discharged the firearm. During subsequent interviews, Pickens also indicated that he was involved in a physical altercation with the individual who shot him. This was corroborated by the surveillance video, which showed Pickens strike Nkosi Albertie-Chamberlain multiple times. Pickens was shown surveillance video showing the events that transpired inside of the establishment. While reviewing the videos, Pickens identified a male who investigators have identified as Nkosi Albertie-Chamberlain during their reviews of the video as the individual who shot him. Pickens also indicated in his sworn affidavit that the person responsible for the shooting was Blaise's brother.

On May 17, 2016, an interview was conducted with [REDACTED] advised that she observed a male she was able to identify as Nkosi Albertie-Chamberlain inside of the aforementioned establishment with his brother Blaise Albertie-Chamberlain. [REDACTED] indicated that Nkosi had threatened her sister with a firearm in recent days. [REDACTED] believed that Nkosi had active warrants stemming from that incident and she subsequently approached Blaise to confirm Nkosi's identity, with the intentions of alerting law enforcement of his presence at the establishment. A short time later, an altercation ensued due to [REDACTED] inquisition of Nkosi's identity. During the altercation, Blaise was restrained by several individuals and during this time, was yelling to Nkosi to go to the vehicle. [REDACTED] advised that it is a well-known fact that Blaise and Nkosi carry firearms and she believed when Blaise ordered Nkosi to go outside, he wanted him to retrieve a firearm. [REDACTED] subsequently left the establishment due her fear that there was going to be a shooting. [REDACTED] made her way to her vehicle, which was parked in an adjacent parking lot. As she did so, she heard multiple gunshots.

Interviews were conducted with [REDACTED] on May 19 and 23, 2016, who was a patron of the aforementioned establishment on the date of this incident. [REDACTED] advised that he saw two individuals who he recognized as brothers inside of the aforementioned establishment and believed them to be from Pensacola. [REDACTED] believed one of the individuals was known as "Blaise." He described one of the individuals as having dreadlocks and one with a "low" haircut. When asked to describe what "low" meant, [REDACTED] indicated it meant a short hair style. [REDACTED] identified the brother with the "low" haircut as being the shooter in this incident and he believed this individual's name was "Blaise." He believed the other individual with the dreadlocks was the brother to the other individual and believed his name was "Nico" or something to that effect. [REDACTED] related that he saw Dallas Corbitt get shot and after seeing this, saw the male he identified as "Blaise" with the low haircut on the other side of the door way in possession of a firearm. It was clear from the interview that [REDACTED] was providing a description of the shooter that matched that of Nkosi Albertie-Chamberlain, but had mistakenly identified him as "Blaise."

During an interview with Angel Castilla on May 23, 2016, he advised that he had been sucker punched while inside of the club by a male unknown to him and identified this same individual as the person who discharged the firearm in this incident. Surveillance video showed Nkosi Albertie-Chamberlain as being the only person who punched Castilla.

During an interview with Dallas Corbitt on May 23, 2016, he acknowledged working security at the aforementioned establishment at the time of the incident. Corbitt recalled several disturbances erupting on the main floor of the establishment. Corbitt identified Blaise Albertie-Chamberlain as being the "mouth" of one of the disturbances and recalled having to physically remove him from the establishment. Corbitt was unaware of any other physical altercations occurring behind him as this was occurring. Once the participants of the altercation were outside of the club, Corbitt heard a loud noise from outside of the establishment. He opened the door to see what the noise was, heard gunshots, felt something hit his chest, smelled gun powder and then could not breathe. It was around at this time he realized he had been shot. Corbitt conceded that he did not see who shot him.

On May 29, 2016, your Affiant had contact with Deputy G. Goult of the Escambia County Sheriff's Office.

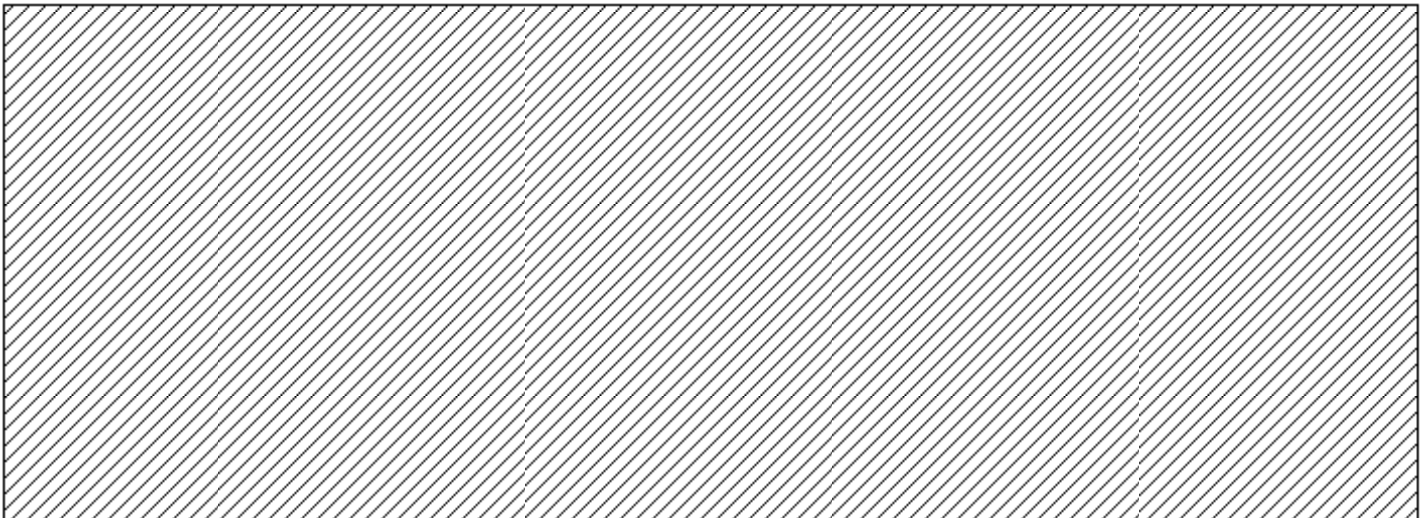
Deputy Goult informed your Affiant that he stopped Nkosi Albertie-Chamberlain operating a 2007 Chery Silverado, blue in color, bearing Florida License #684QBD, for committing a traffic infraction at the intersection of Washington Street and Webb Street in Cantonment, Florida. Upon making contact with Nkosi, Deputy Goult inquired if Nkosi was in possession of any firearms inside of the vehicle and he indicated he was not. Deputy Goult learned of BOLO information regarding Nkosi and the vehicle he had stopped. Additionally, during contact with the vehicle, a strong odor of marijuana was detected emitting from the entire of the vehicle. A law enforcement canine also positively alerted to the presence of narcotics emitting from the vehicle. Nkosi was subsequently detained and during this process, a .40 caliber Glock 27 Gen 4, serial number [REDACTED] with an attached belt clip was recovered from his person along with three magazines. Nkosi was asked why he did not volunteer that he was in possession of a firearm and he claimed he was scared. During a lawful search of the vehicle, additional ammunition, an additional firearm, a spent .40 caliber shell casing, silver in color, and a valid Pike County, Alabama Pistol Permit were located.

Your Affiant responded to the scene of the traffic stop and made contact with Nkosi Albertie-Chamberlain during this time. Post Miranda, Nkosi initially claimed he might have been present on the Red Rose Gentlemen's Club on May 15, 2016. When asked if he had an altercation the last time he was present at the establishment, Nkosi "pled the fifth." Nkosi then claimed he could not recall being at the aforementioned establishment on the date in question.

Nkosi was shown video of he and Blaise Albertie-Chamberlain from the establishment and Nkosi claimed that he was having problems viewing the video due to having blurry contact lenses and then questioned the quality of the video. Nkosi then claimed he couldn't see himself in the video he was shown. Nkosi then denied being present in the aforementioned establishment on the date in question and then claimed he could not recall being present. When confronted that witnesses had also placed he and Blaise at the aforementioned establishment, Nkosi informed me that he was being represented by legal counsel and advised that he did not want answer any more questions.

The .40 caliber Glock 27, Gen 4, serial number [REDACTED] were provided to your Affiant by Deputy Goult for evidentiary purposes as this caliber firearm matched shell casings recovered from the scene of the shooting and was lodged into the custody of the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office Evidence Section (Evidence Exhibit 75). This firearm was submitted to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement Crime Laboratory for ballistic comparisons to shell casings recovered from the crime scene (Evidence Exhibits 40, 41, and 42).

On June 2, 2016, your Affiant applied for and was granted a search warrant for Nkosi Albertie-Chamberlain's 2007 Chevy Silverado, blue in color, bearing Florida License #684QBD, by Judge Mary Polson. The search warrant allowed for the search of spent .40 caliber shell casings. The search warrant was delivered to the Escambia County Sheriff's Office for service. Investigators Mike Milstead and Josh Hendershot executed the search warrant and recovered the shell casing that had been located at the time of the traffic stop. This shell casing was turned over to your Affiant, who submitted the item to the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office Evidence Section (Evidence Exhibit 78). This shell casing was submitted to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement Crime Laboratory for ballistic comparisons to the firearm seized from Nkosi (Exhibit 75).

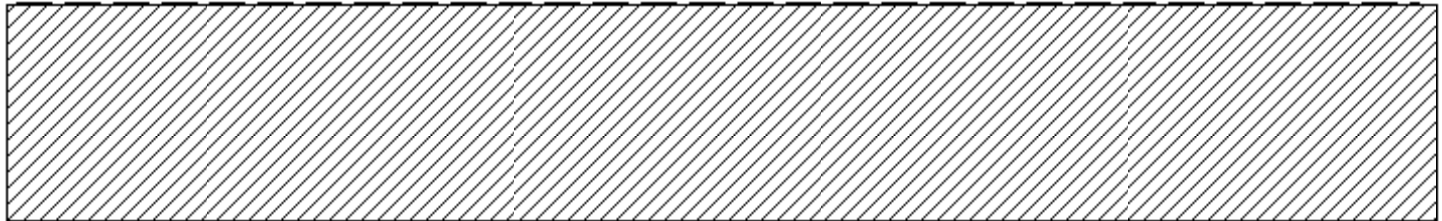

On October 6, 2016, your Affiant received Florida Department of Law Enforcement Crime Laboratory results for the following exhibits:

- Exhibit #40 - One fired 40 S&W caliber cartridge case
- Exhibit #41 - One fired 40 S&W caliber cartridge case
- Exhibit #42 - One fired 40 S&W caliber cartridge case
- Exhibit #75 - Glock 40 S&W caliber semiautomatic pistol, model 27 Gen 4, serial number UYN096, with an attached belt clip and three detachable box magazines
- Exhibit #78 - One fired 40 S&W caliber cartridge case

The results of the examination are as follows:

The Exhibit #40, #41 and #42 cartridge cases were fired in the Exhibit #75 pistol.

The Exhibit #78 cartridge case displays class characteristics similar to cartridge cases fired in the Exhibit #75 pistol; however, differences in individual characteristics suggest another firearm was used. These differences are insufficient for an elimination. The Exhibit #78 cartridge case displays characteristics similar to firearms by Glock and Smith & Wesson (Sigma series pistols) among possible others.

On October 6, 2016, I spoke with William Black, the technician who conducted the analysis. He confirmed that with me he was positive the firearm in Exhibit #75 fired the shell casings listed in Exhibits #41, 42, and 43.

Multiple attempts to interview Blaise Albertie-Chamberlain have been attempted and he has refused to cooperate in this investigation without counsel present.

This is in violation of F.S.S. 784.045(1a2) Aggravated Battery With A Firearm Arm (3 Counts) and did occur in Okaloosa County, Florida.
