[STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE / NARRATIVE]

Investigator Douglas G. Schwall, hereinafter referred to as your Affiant, is a sworn and bonded law enforcement officer. Your Affiant is currently employed by the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office (OCSO) with over 20 years of total civilian law enforcement experience in the State of Florida. Your Affiant is currently assigned to the OCSO Criminal Investigations Division as an Investigator. Your Affiant being duly sworn states as follows:

On 06/24/18, at approximately 0631 hours, the OCSO was dispatched to 656 S Santa Rosa Blvd, Fort Walton Beach, FL and discovered; upon their arrival, the victim; identified as Filip Lachezarov Kirilov, deceased in the front passenger seat of a Kia mini-van bearing FL tag IDIB13. The vehicle, which was in the middle of the intersection of Porpoise Street and Nautilus Court, was still running and was in the transmission was in park. It appeared that the victim had been shot multiple times and may have been the victim of foul play. Upon making this discovery, the crime scene was secured.

During the investigation, discovered inside the van were Uber placard(s) which indicated the vehicle may have been used for short term contracted taxi-style fares. Also found was a Rexing S300 portable monitoring device and other electronic equipment. Upon executing a Search Warrant on the victim's above mentioned vehicle, the Rexing S300 device was forensically examined and it was learned this item had a camera, positioned on the front windshield, which had the ability to record out the front windshield. This camera captured video as well as audio. The following is a synopsis of the video, as it relates to the Probable Cause Affidavit:

- (a) At the :35 second mark of the video, a male voice; believed to be the Defendant, instructs the victim where to drop him off which would be behind the Tom Thumb convenience store on Nautilus Court.
- (b) At the :50 second mark, the vehicle turns off of South Santa Rosa Blvd and turns on to Porpoise Street.
- (c) At the :59 second mark, the vehicle stops in the middle of the intersection of Porpoise and Nautilus and a short conversation between the Defendant and the victim ensues.
- (d) At 1:05 into the video, the first gunshot occurs and based on audio heard, the victim is struck. The rear sliding door to the victim's vehicle is then opened.
- (e) At the 1:12 mark, a second gunshot is heard along with the shattering of glass. This is consistent with the fact the driver's side window was found damaged with a bullet hole in the middle of it. After the second gunshot, the rear door can be heard being closed.
- (f) At the 1:18 mark, the front passenger side door is opened.
- (g) At the 1:22 mark, there is a third gunshot followed by a rustling sound.
- (h) At the 1:34 mark, the front passenger door is closed; and
- (i) At 1:35 into the video, the Defendant is seen on video running southbound towards the Aqua Villa condos. His physical features and clothes worn are captured along with the fact he is in possession of a dark colored backpack.

Investigators obtained additional surveillance video from surrounding condominiums that depicted the male's backpack being dark in color with silver or white piping. With the videos obtained, it is believed the victim was shot and subsequently died at or around 0437 hours.

Contact was made with the Medical Examiner's (ME) Office who found multiple deformities; leading your Affiant to believe that the death of the victim was a homicide.

An emergency query through Uber for records pertaining to the victim's fare log for 06/23/18-06/24/18 was requested. Uber provided the log's registered to the victim which included a fare for "Joe Smith" and listed a telephone number 918-210-5058. The telephone number was used to schedule the fares for the "Joe Smith" account. It was found that "Joe Smith" had been picked up in Destin on 06/24/18 at approximately 0427 hours with a final destination of 670 Nautilus Court, Fort Walton Beach (Okaloosa Island). The same "Joe Smith" account had a pick-up on 06/24/18 at approximately U513 hours at 1299 Miracle Strip Parkway, Fort Walton Beach, with a drop off at 798 Kelly Street, Destin on the same date at approximately 0524 hours.

On 06/25/18, Deputy Burnham made contact with a suspicious male at McDonald's, 895 Harbor Boulevard, Destin, FL. The male was identified as Timothy Layne Anderson by his United States passport. At the time of contact, Anderson met some of the physical characteristics as seen in the various videos obtained by law enforcement. He was found to be in possession of a dark colored backpack with silver piping and a black smartphone with a shattered screen.

On this same date (06/25/18) the autopsy of the victim was conducted at the Office of the Medical Examiner in Pensacola, Florida. After an internal and external examination of the body, the death of the victim was ruled as a Homicide. It should be noted that there were 2 projectiles recovered from the victim and he was found to have been shot three times; with entrance wounds found in the forehead (just above the right eyebrow), the back of the neck, and the right cheek.

At approximately 2030 hours, on 06/25/18, I made contact with the Uber driver who picked up "Joe Smith" on 06/24/18 at approximately 0513 hours. He indicated the subject was actually picked up at the Holiday Inn Resort on Okaloosa Island (Miracle Strip Pkwy) and was dropped off at the AOC Food Mart; located at the intersection of Main Street and Kelly Street in Destin.

The next day (06/26/18), video surveillance was obtained from Holiday Inn Resort.

On 06/26/18, investigators obtained a subpoena requesting the subscriber information for telephone number 918-210-5058, addressed to the cellular carrier Tracfone. Tracfone provided investigators with documentation identifying the purchase location as Walmart, 15017 Emerald Coast Parkway, Destin, FL with a purchase date of 06/13/18.

On 06/26/18, OCSO Inv. Landis obtained video surveillance from Walmart which depicted the defendant, Timothy Layne Anderson, returning items to the store and receiving a gift card from the business. Anderson had to provide his identification card which was stored in the store's database to complete the return. Anderson then purchased the Tracfone from the store using the gift card.

Contact was made with Anderson and he was brought to the OCSO - CID Offices in Shalimar for an interview. Prior to any questions being asked, Anderson was advised of his Miranda Rights; doing so from a pre-printed text. After Anderson indicated he understood he rights, no request was made to have an attorney present nor was a request made to not answer questions. In his interview, Anderson admitted to the following:

- (a) He admitted to having an application on his cell phone for Uber and that he has utilized Uber in the recent past
- (b) Admitted to being the person depicted in the Walmart video purchasing the Tracfone and the person in the video from the Holiday Inn Resort, shortly after the homicide.
- (c) Admitted to still having the shoes, clothing, and backpack in the surveillance video from 06/24/18.

Based on the above stated facts and investigation, I find probable cause to believe that TIMOTHY LAYNE ANDERSON violated F.S.S. 782.04.1A1 – First Degree Murder. This offense occurred in Okaloosa County, where I am a sworn deputy.

any questions being asked, Anderson was advised of his Miranda Rights; doing so from a pre-printed text. After Anderson indicated he understood he rights, no request was made to have an attorney present nor was a request made to not answer questions. In his interview, Anderson admitted to the following:

- (a) He admitted to having an application on his cell phone for Uber and that he has utilized Uber in the recent past
(b) Admitted to being the person depicted in the Walmart video purchasing the Tracfone and the person in the video from the Holiday Inn Resort, shortly after the homicide.
(c) Admitted to still having the shoes, clothing, and backpack in the surveillance video from 06/24/18.

Based on the above stated facts and investigation, I find probable cause to believe that TIMOTHY LAYNE ANDERSON violated F.S.S. 782.04.1A1 - First Degree Murder. This offense occurred in Okaloosa County, where I am a sworn deputy.
