[ STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE / NARRATIVE ]

On October 13, 2018, at 1010 Blvd De La Parisienne, Mary Esther, Christopher Michael Burke committed the offense of aggravated battery in violation of Florida State Statute 784.045.1a2. The victims were identified as Rachel Christine Delaney and Benjamin Scott Delaney. The witnesses were identified as John Paul Hess and Tina Carol Steward.

INTERVIEWS

On October 13, the following information was learned:

B. Delaney provided a sworn, written affidavit of complaint advising the following: Burke was parked in the driveway of Hess's aforementioned residence. R. Delaney approached the vehicle and argued with Burke. Burke struck R. Delaney with the driver's side door of the vehicle, causing her to fall to the ground. In fear that Burke would continue his attack on R. Delaney, B. Delaney began striking Burke in the face and head and forcefully removed Burke from the vehicle. Burke entered back into the vehicle placed the vehicle in drive and grabbed R. Delaney by the hair through the driver's side window which was down. Burke made the statement that he was going to drag R. Delaney as he began to roll forward in the vehicle. B. Delaney forcefully removed Burke from the vehicle a second time. The vehicle rolled across the street into the neighbor's driveway at 1011 Blvd De La Parisienne, Mary Esther. Burke got back into the vehicle backed

the vehicle into the street pointing south on Blvd De La Parisienne. At some point during the incident, Burke pulled the vehicle forward running over B. Delaney's leg and R. Delaney's torso. Burke stopped the vehicle and B. Delaney began yelling at Burke to move the vehicle because he believed the vehicle was stopped with the front driver's side tire resting on R. Delaney. Burke backed the vehicle up and drove off fleeing the scene prior to law enforcement's arrival.

Hess provided a sworn, written statement advising Burke drove off in reverse and ran over B. Delaney and R. Delaney.

On October 14, the following information was learned after Burke contacted the non-emergency line to report a battery which occurred on October 13:

Burke advised he went to the aforementioned residence with Hess and Steward. Burke and Steward were waiting in the driveway for Hess to return. R. Delaney approached the vehicle and attempted to enter the vehicle by climbing into Burke's lap. Burke attempted to keep R. Delaney at bay by using his arms as a buffer. R. Delaney fell out of the vehicle. B. Delaney approached the vehicle and began to strike Burke in the face. B. Delaney forcefully removed Burke from the vehicle. Burke was able to get back into the vehicle and attempted to flee by placing the vehicle in drive. B. Delaney removed Burke from the vehicle a second time and continued his attack. The vehicle rolled into the neighbor's driveway where Burke regained control of the vehicle. Burke backed the vehicle into the roadway facing south on Blvd De La Parisienne. Burke pulled forward to pick up Steward. B. Delaney began attacking the vehicle damaging the rain guard on the driver's side window. Burke heard B. Delaney say that Burke broke his leg but thought it was an exaggeration because B. Delaney was standing up. Burke left the scene. Burke denied grabbing R. Delaney by the hair and denied any knowledge that he ran over anyone or anything. Burke did not report the incident on the day of occurrence because he did not believe it was necessary because he was not hurt that bad, out of fear that he would get in trouble for drinking and driving, and because he was in possession of marijuana.

Steward advised while she and Burke were waiting for Hess in the driveway, R. Delaney approached the driver's side of the vehicle. R. Delaney attempted to enter the vehicle by climbing into Burke's lap. R. Delaney fell from the vehicle and B. Delaney began striking Burke and pulled him from the vehicle. Steward separated R. Delaney from Burke and B. Delaney and had her stand closer to the residence. Steward saw the vehicle rolling into the neighbor's yard. Steward saw Burke regain control of the vehicle and pull forward to pick her up. Steward observed B. Delaney damaging the vehicle and heard him say you broke my leg, but again she believed B. Delaney was exaggerating because he was standing. Steward got into the vehicle and left with Burke. Steward denied having any knowledge that R. Delaney or B. Delaney were run over. Steward could not advise where R. Delaney was standing when the vehicle rolled into the neighbor's driveway.

R. Delaney had been sedated and was in intensive care for approximately four days, and I was unable to interview her until October 17 at which time the following information was learned:

R. Delaney's memory of the events was limited since she was sedated for three days and she was heavily intoxicated on the day of occurrence. In a sworn, written affidavit of complaint, she advised the following:

R. Delaney was talking to Burke when he became angry and grabbed her by the hair. Burke began to drive off while holding her by the hair which caused her to fall to the ground. Burke then ran over R. Delaney's torso.

INJURIES

B. Delaney's suffered from abrasions to the head and face and a bloody nose and lip which were consistent with being involved in an altercation. He also suffered from a broken leg which was consistent with being run over by a vehicle.

R. Delaney suffered from severe internal bleeding, a broken hip, bruising, and abrasions which were consistent with being run over by a vehicle. R. Delaney had to undergo several surgeries to repair the damage from the broken hip and the internal bleeding.

Burke suffered from abrasions to his head and face and was missing a tooth. He also had a mark around his neck which appeared to have been from his shirt collar being pulled against his skin.

EVIDENCE/FINDINGS

Upon my arrival, R. Delaney was found laying in the driveway of Hess' house near the mailbox. A lock of blonde hair was found in the roadway. Black plastic from the rain guard on Burke's 2005 Chevy Suburban, bearing Florida tag L266RH, was found near R. Delaney, in the driveway, and in the roadway. A single blonde hair was found in the weather seal of the driver's side window of Burke's vehicle. This evidence corroborated R. Delaney's and B. Delaney's statements.

Burke delayed reporting the incident, denied grabbing R. Delaney's hair, and was unable to explain the lock of hair in the roadway and the hair in the weather seal of his vehicle.

Steward delayed reporting the incident, initially stated she moved R. Delaney to a safe location near the residence, but was unable to provide details regarding R. Delaney's location when she was run over. Based on where I found R. Delaney, it appeared she was run over in the driveway or near the driveway. This contradicts Steward's statement of having move R. Delaney closer to Hess' residence for safety.

These offenses occurred in Okaloosa County where I am a full time, bonded, sworn law enforcement officer.
