[STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE / NARRATIVE]

On 19 July 2019, Defendant Courtney Dewayne Ayers committed the unlawful felonious offense of Kidnapping by threatening victim Paul G. Parks , abducting Parks against his will without any lawful authority and coercing Parks into engaging into a scheme to facilitate fraud.

In a sworn interview with victim Paul G Parks, Parks advised he was solicited for work by defendant Courtney Ayers at the Fort Walton Beach Landing at approximately 8:20am on 19 July 2019.

Afterwards, Defendant Courtney Dewayne Ayers took photos of Parks identification and his Regions bank card.

Co-defendant Tabias Jabbar Wimby drove Parks and defendant Courtney Ayers to a thrift store in Destin.

Defendant Courtney Ayers went inside the thrift store and purchased clothing for Parks to make him more presentable.

Co-defendant Tabias Jabbar Wimby drove Parks and defendant Courtney Ayers to the Regions Bank at 100 Main Street in Destin.

Defendant Courtney Ayers gave Parks a check to cash using his Regions Bank account and to return with such money.

Regions Bank would not cash the check until the check cleared and Parks returned to the vehicle without the money.

Co-defendant Tabias Jabbar Wimby subsequently drove Parks and defendant Courtney Ayers to the Bank of America in Destin located at 1014 Highway 98 E, Destin, FL 32541.

Parks provided the vehicle information of a Black Nissan with a temporary Georgia license plate.

Parks advised his orange Auburn shirt was in the back seat along with a box and his black wallet.

Deputy Mundt located a black Georgia Nissan Altima with Georgia temporary tag P0033086 and executed a traffic stop on Beal Parkway near Pelham Road.

Co-defendant Tabias Jabbar Wimby was driving the vehicle and defendant Courtney Ayers was a passenger and had the keyless fob to the vehicle in his pocket.

Victim Parks positively identified defendant Courtney Ayers and as the person who solicited him for work and gave him the checks.
